Designing a Mentorship Program Lessons Learned

- What makes your program different?
- Establish guiding principles and stick with them
- Launch with a structured program designed for scale
- Anticipate failure points
- Make it easy for mentors have specific commitments
- Remote mentorships create global diverse opportunities
- Build a non-profit strategy based on for-profit tactics
 - Managing supply and demand
 - Marketing strategy know your customer
 - Know who will sponsor you and who will not
 - Provide excellent customer care/support
