



Technological Progress Can Expand Job Opportunities






Advances in Technology Call for New Skills seemingly overnight: "Adaptability" is Increasingly in Demand



Beta Version of the Platform and Wallet were developed with close support, mentoring and funding from TS Technology and Innovation Team



Bitmal partnered with Ruwwad Al Tanmiya in Jordan, that has more than 1000 volunteers to deploy the beta version of the Wallet and the platform



Programme Design

Job Matching and Facilitation/ Elancing workshop

- 940 youth and 26 SMEs trained;
- 150 best profiles selected for Upwork pilot: 128 participants completed 411 jobs and earned \$4100;
- 17% secured jobs outside of the pilot earning \$7671, 71% of which have been generated by participants whose high-quality work has qualified them as Enterprise clients;
- 39 participants earned a Job Success Score.

Digital Entrepreneurship

- Six months Incubation program (full time);
- Youth and startup teams;
- Male and Female Cohort;
- Additional training on Soft Skills.

Digital Skills Programme

- Six months programme with two levels: basic and intermediary;
- Two streams: Programming & Tech and Digital Marketing, Graphics & Design;
- 180 youth (Male and Female Cohort);
- Online and formal job matching.

Kosovo's female labor force participation at **21.4** % and female unemployment at **36.3** %, with income losses due to gender inequalities up to **28** %. Global digital economy and domestic IT sector can absorb more qualified labor

To test out how global digital economy jobs could assist in creating inclusive and better employment opportunities for women

1-year technical assistance component: training, outreach, and impact evaluation

150 un/underemployed 18-40 y.o. women from 5 municipalities

- * ≥ 66 % graduates earn ≥ €100 through online work in 3 months after pilot end
- *Improved beneficiaries' IT and socio-emotional skills
- *Increased level of networking and mentorship among beneficiaries
- *Raised awareness among beneficiaries and nationally about online work



W:W Results and Outcomes

>1,100 women expressed interest in two phases of WoW in 5 municipalities; 166 enrolled; 5 pilot iterations

<30 news stories generated by media;</p>
<20 events & TV/radio appearances;</p>
FB group with 4,000+ members

84 trainees found at least **1 online job**, the first online contract was gained during **week #3** of the pilot

>50,000hrs tracked on online learning platform, cumulatively

Average in-class participation **38** online participation **50**

~35% of the "early enrolled" dropped out/expelled due to insufficient skills, time and other commitments, lack of a job guarantee

335 online jobs gained, cumulatively generating ~\$30K; 6 real jobs in local IT market (~\$10K)

Impact Sourcing Model

- In 2001, DDD pioneered the impact sourcing model of offering employment in BPO services to people from underserved communities thereby providing them a path to economic self-sufficiency.
- DDD's proven work-study model recruits, trains, and employs underserved youth in Cambodia, Laos, and Kenya and military veterans and spouses in the US in in-demand digital skills such as data analytics, machine learning, and cloud computing.
- Program participants graduate with relevant professional and soft skills, formal educational credentials, and work experience as a stepping stone to professional jobs—and out of poverty.

To date, DDD has empowered thousands of youth. Here are some of the results:



3,000 youth provided with long-term work experience



50% of program participants are women and **10%** are persons with disabilities



1,700 young employees graduated with college degrees



DDD graduates earn **6x** the average monthly salary of their peers, increasing their lifetime earnings by more than **USD \$175,000**
